

Yavneh College Distance Measuring for Year 7 entry 2012

1. Criterion 3 states that priority will be given to 'children for whom Yavneh College is their 'nearest maintained Jewish secondary school'

Each applicant will be measured from their Address Point to the Address Point of the schools listed above, using data as supplied by Hertfordshire County Council. These measurements will be straight line measurements provided through "SMART" software.

For Hasmonean, Applicants will be identified by gender and measured against the appropriate site.

SEN, Siblings and feeder school applicants will also not be measured for criterion 3.

If Herts CC data shows two schools, one of which is Yavneh College, as being equidistant and nearest to an applicant's Address Point, then the applicant will be deemed to be nearest to Yavneh College.

2. Criterion 4 states that in the event of over-subscription after each of criteria 1-3 has been applied, proximity to the School of the child's address point as at the deadline for application, will in each of the criteria 1-3 be the determining factor.

Methodology:

Each applicant will be measured along a straight line between applicant's home Address Point to the Address Point of Yavneh College. Distances are supplied by Hertfordshire County Council, who use a computerised mapping system to two decimal places.

All applicants will be measured to provide their home-to-school distance for ranking purposes. In the event of a tie, random allocation, overseen by an independent adjudicator, will be used to determine who should get the place.

3. General Notes

Hertfordshire County Council will provide all distances which will be measured along a straight line between applicant's home address point and the relevant school.

Distances are measured using a computerised mapping system to two decimal places. The measurement is taken from the address point of the applicant's house to the address point of the school. Address point data is a nationally recognised method of identifying individual residences. This is an objective method of measuring home school distances when applying admissions rules.

Home address is as defined by Hertfordshire County Council.
