



## Travel Information

### Train services

Elstree and Borehamwood Station is 10 minutes walk from the school. There are frequent trains to Elstree and Borehamwood Station from West Hampstead, Hendon, Mill Hill Broadway, Radlett and St.Albans. ### Bus services

The school is very well-served by bus routes from surrounding areas of Hertfordshire and NW London, as listed below. These buses stop at the bus interchange at the Tesco Superstore on Shenley Road, Borehamwood, where a short walkway, marshalled by the school's security team at the beginning and end of the school day, leads directly from Tesco to the school site in Hillside Avenue.

N.B. To the best of our knowledge the above information is correct as at September 2010. The E721 and E722 ('E' Education Assisted Routes) are bus services provided by Hertfordshire Passenger Transport Unit for Yavneh College pupils at the start and end of the school day. Application Forms are available through the Hertfordshire Customer Service Centre on 0300 123 4043. The other bus services listed above are public buses.

### Additional Services

In addition to the bus and train services listed above, we are setting up additional transport services for pupils from Hendon, Mill Hill, Barnet, Cockfosters and Southgate. Further routes will be considered, depending on demand. Parents will pay a subsidised fee for these school buses.

## **Will my child get free transport to school?**

1. The Transport for London website gives full information about 11 - 15 Oyster photocard which enable children to use London buses and trams for free and obtain child fares on all Tube, DLR, London Overground and National Rail Services. A child can use an 11 -1 5 Oyster photocard whether or not the child is resident in a London borough.
2. If a child is aged 16 - 18 and in full time education a 16+ zip Oyster photocard can be obtained which gives concessionary travel on bus, Tube, DLR, London Overground and some National Rail Services.
3. There is also an 18+ student photocard that can be applied for to get some concessions if your child is in full time education.
4. Hertfordshire County Council phased out free transport to faith schools on public transport services (other than those where free or discounted travel is available with an Oyster photocard)from September 2007. The following two categories of secondary-age children, however, have continued to receive free transport after this date:
  - a. Low Income Families who qualify for free school meals or whose parents are in receipt of their maximum level of Working Tax Credit, continue to receive free transport to their nearest faith school if that school is between 2 and 15 miles of the child's home.
  - b. Children with siblings already in statutory education at the faith school that they join, whose siblings are getting free denominational transport under a previous faith policy, are also entitled to free transport.
5. Other local authorities have their own policies on free transport to faith schools, which may be different to Hertfordshire's.

## **Travel by car**

Hillside Avenue is a narrow residential road which has one other school situated in it in addition to Yavneh College. Parents are requested not to drive down Hillside Avenue to drop their children off as this causes congestion and reduces the safety of the children as they cross the road. If parents do want to deliver their children to school by car they are asked to drop them off in the Tesco car park and the children can walk through to the school.

## **Cycling to School**

Pupils are encouraged to cycle to school. The campus is well-provided with cycle racks where pupils can store their bicycles during the day.'
